

JUNE BISANTZ & ALEX NAKHIMOVSKY

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Vocalist JUNE BISANTZ has co-written and produced several collections of original vocal jazz, all of which have received national recognition. She has toured internationally, and performed and recorded with distinguished jazz musicians including Steve Swallow, Bob Moses, Paul Brown, Lew Soloff, Jerry Neiwood, Mike Stern, Steve Davis & Will Lee. Reviews and articles about her work have appeared in publications including People Magazine, USA Today, JazzQuad.Ru, Jazziz Magazine, Jazz Podium Magazine, Jazz USA, the New York Times, New York Newsday & the Boston Globe.

Bisantz' 2012 release, It's Always You, was inspired by the vocal work of the legendary Chet Baker, paying tribute to his fascinationg career. Her current release Love's Tango, co-authored with pianist & composer Alex Nakhimovsky, signals her return to original music with a collection of Latin inspired songs about love in all its many forms.

Ms. Bisantz is also Professor Emeritus of Art & Design at Eastern Connecticut State University and has exhibited her visual art work in galleries, museums and public spaces throughout the United States.

Pianist ALEX NAKHIMOVSKY enjoys a versatile career as a performer, recording artist, producer, composer and educator. His musical accomplishments as a jazz and classical artist include musical direction, arranging, solo and ensemble performances.

He has toured throughout the United States, Russia, Japan and Israel, performing with jazz legends Benny Golson, Jackie McLean, Jimmy Cobb, Valery Ponomarev, Sheila Jordan, Curtis Fuller, Victor Bailey and Grammy-nominated artists Bill Evans, Jazzmeia Horn & Rene Marie. His performance as soloist with award winning Joe Hisaishi's New Japan Philharmonic Orchestra in Tokyo was recorded and released on the Universal label as American In Paris in 2005. Later that year, Nakhimovsky toured with the Orchestra, performing in Japan's major concert halls.

As co-producer of Russia's Baikal Waves International.Jazz Festival since 2006, Alex has made cross-cultural connections for several Russian Music Festivals, bringing important international artists such as Tania Maria, Richard Bona, Mike Stern, Jeff Tain Watts & Jeff Lorber to Russia.

LOVE'S TANGO is a collection of original latin/jazz songs co-written by June Bisantz & Alexander Nakhimovsky. Bisantz & Nakhimovsky have recorded, performed and toured together since 2005. This is their third recording project together and first writing collaboration. They share a background in classical music, a love of Latin rhythms and jazz harmonies, and a serious playfulness that has distinguished and energized their partnership.

The CD features three bossa novas, two sambas, a Rachmaninoff-inspired string quartet prelude and one unique tango, from which the project gets its name. Also featured along with the many accomplished musicians on this recording, are renowned trombonist Steve Davis and smooth jazz guitarist Norman Johnson.

LOVE'S TANGO celebrates the many ways we experience love - romantically, exuberantly and philosophically - with the Latin rhythms, classical ideas and jazz improvisations that characterize all things Tango.

Along with collaborators pianist Alex Nakhimovsky and guitarist Norman Johnson, the group achieves its goal by emulation rather than imitation.

Bisantz captures Baker's soft, intimate vocal sound, the key to making the project work. It's a vocal style completely out of step with current "diva" practice: seemingly almost casual, with no overt technical or emotional display."

Chet Baker's intimate vocals have influenced countless jazz artists, June Bisantz among them. In fact, the Connecticutbased singer follows Let's Fall in Love, her 2006 Chet Baker tribute album, with the self-released It's Always You: June Bisantz Sinas Chet Baker Vol. 2. Bisantz keeps the proceedings appropriately hushed, her singing — which, many have noted, resembles that of Phoebe Snow - sensitively shaded by pianist Alex Nakhimovsky, guitarist Norman Johnson, bassist Matt Dwonszyk and drummer Ben Belillo. The vocalist delivers shivers with an intonation that bears the glint of moonlit melancholy but hardly lacks for warmth - particularly when she's accompanied by just Nakhimovsky and Johnson, or solely by the guitarist, or when she goes it alone, as she does on an a cappella read of "Spring Is Here." Bisantz's horn-like phrasing floats atop the quartet's sterling accompaniment on "It's Always You," our selection. The track also features the Baker-like trumpet of Gabor Viragh and reminds listeners that the tributee was also a distinctively soulful horn player.

The legendary Chet Baker's horn sounds almost like a human voice. Baker's unique singing voice is remembered by jazz fans and still excites the imagination. The cult of Chet Baker is alive, and June Bisantz is among those who make sure it continues to live. June Bisantz is a vocalist and master of Visual Arts from Connecticut - an accomplished musician with a solid jazz background. She has performed with Steve Swallow, Mike Stern, Lou Soloff, Boh Moses, In 2000 Bisant released Let's Fall in Love, based on the vocal repertoire of Chet Baker, which got good press and recognition from jazz lovers. After the release of this CD, June made a successful concert tour in Jap new Chet Baker project: It's Always You: June Bisantz Sings Chet Baker, Vol.2 The collection of 12 songs, include popular, well-known tunes from Baker's repertor with rare, seldom sung songs, like Chet's own composition from his "Italian period", So Che Ti Baker's voice, as you know, was high in timbre, and maybe that's why June's singing seems so close to the original. June masterfully recreates the soft, lyrical, very intimate singing style of Baker. Her pure, beautiful voice with expressive intonations envelops the listener and immerses one in an imaginary jazz club atmosphere - an atmosphere which is especially advantageous for this music. Bisantz created It's Always You with the same group of musicians who participated in the recording of her first Baker-based album. And here, almost everyone deserves the warmest praise. Alex Nakhimovsky plays a dual role in the creation of this album as both pianist and arranger. I attribute the highest praise to his piano in his duet with June, Born to Be Blue. Also memorable are Forgetful and You're Mine You, duets with the sensual guitar of Norman Johnson. Trumpeter Gabor Viragh faced a particular challenge - playing in the style of Chet Baker is not easy. However, the sound of his horn in $Ev^{\prime}vy$ Time We Say Goodbye is beyond praise. Nevertheless, the spectacular point of the album is the last song, June Bisantz without accompaniment. 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

Jazz greats and up-and-comers let it rip in Goshen—if it's jazz

The Litchfield Jazz Festival will celebrate its 18th season at the Goshen Fairgrounds, Aug. 9-11. After a three-year stint at The Kent School, the festival returned to its roots last summer, and got its groove back.

A stellar lineup includes both seasoned and emerging arisis. Opening the show Emme Coben, the 22-year-old pianist and Litchfield lazz Camp alum who recently placed third in the Thelonias Monk Plano Competition. Bisantz started the Chet Baker Project a few years ago, and the same musicians have been with her since the inception. Bisantz said "Chet Baker really gets into your heart and soul. Whatever happened in his checkered life, his musicianship outlasts it all".

Included in the set were "Let's Fall in Love", "It's Always You", "Born to be Blue", "It Could Happen to You", "There Will Never Be Another You" and "Let's Get Lost". Bisantz, who is also an accomplished visual artist, dedicated "Imagination" to all the dreamers out there. She finished her superb set with "Ev'ry Time We Say Goodbye."

"Chet Baker's lyrical trumpet and soft vocal style epitomized the cool jazz sound emanating from the West Coast in the 1950s. Singer June Bisantz channels that feeling on "It's Always You", the second CD inspired by Baker's sound.

Her smoky voice and artful sense of time are showcased as she covers a dozen tunes associated with Chet Baker. Bisantz gets stellar support from pianist Alex Nakhiovsky and guitarist Norman *Johnson. She teams with both on* Everything Depends on You and Born to Be Blue, and with just Johnson on Forgetful, "You're Mine You" and "The Night we Called it a Day". Gaobr Viragh adds Baker-like trumpet accompaniment on four tracks, most notably "My Ideal" and the wistful "Evr'y Time We Say Goodbye". Bisantz closes things out with a brief a capella take on "Spring is Here".

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LET'S FALL IN LOVE: JUNE BISANTZ SINGS CHET BAKER Toodle-e Records

Any album saluting the wonderful jazz trumpeter and sometime singer Chet Baker gets my attention and my ear. It's a pretty safe bet you'll start with top-drawer and emotional material in any case, as he favored well-crafted, plaintive melodies and lyrics. Once again, I bring you good news: this is a keeper.

June Bisantz Evans works primarily as a visual artist, although in my eclectic collection of old vinyl, I have some 1980s recordings under the group name "Mister Spats" with June as the lead vocalist and co-writer of the jazzy songs. She's made a few recordings, including a solo album 10 years ago. This new CD revisits some standards with Baker's low-key, languid style in mind, but comes across as just plain warm rather than warmed-over. What's been included in June's tunes? Not the expected Chet signature "Let's Get Lost," and the album title doesn't mean you get the standard "Let's Fall In Love" either (it refers to the key line in the opener "For Heaven's Sake"). There are 12 tracks, all strong entries. Classics such as a slow, reflective "Come Rain Or Come Shine," shorn of its intrinsic determination, are attractive in their own way. Another Broadway number is "I've Never Been In Love Before" from Guys And Dolls which also takes its time but is worth the time it takes: it's drenched in romance. Two show tunes from Rodgers and Hart, "My Funny Valentine" and "Blue Room," also make for slo-mo happy moods. June evokes Chet Baker's small voice and tender, thoughtful phrasing and is aided by the skilled Gabor Viragh standing in as the trumpet and fluegelhorn man.

Sorrow and fragility do not overwhelm the atmosphere even though they linger at the edges. Although she sounds quite sensitive and thoughtful, June's timbre conjures up a person with more emotional distance and perspective. In fact, there's an older-but-wiser maternal presence, a bit in the later Rosemary Clooney mold. Her timbre also reminds me of Nancy Wilson, even more so in the Mister Spats work where she used more voice.

In preparing to write this comparison study, I also went back and re-listened to some Chet Baker vocals I hadn't heard for a while. It was a refreshing refresher course, but confirmed that this is not a knockoff copy nor a radical departure. The essence is there but there's some freshness, too. The good taste and subtle, skilled playing from the band members here should not be underestimated. The players are to be commended. In addition to the aforementioned brass player, pianist Alex Nakhimovsky is quite wonderful and gets ample opportunity to be heard and add to the classy environment. Guitarist Norman Johnson, drummer Greg Caputo and bass player Genevieve Rose complete a pleasing picture.
